Specialized Academic Curriculum

- Beginner I-II, Intermediate I-II, Advanced I Korean are offered as elective courses for students whose proficiency in the Korean language is equivalent to TOPIK Levels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5
- Korean writing courses for various levels, intensive Korean reading courses covering various topics and major
 specific Korean language courses (humanities/social sciences or natural sciences/engineering) are all offered
- Exploration courses are offered so students can get a taste of majors of interest before making a final decision
