



♦Leave of Absence


- O KUPID → Registration/Graduation → [University Registration] Application for Leave of Absence/Return
- o Students can take off maximum of 2 consecutive semesters at a time and the total numbers cannot exceed 3 semesters.
- o The period of 'Leave of Absence' is included in the term of years for thesis submission.
- o Contact the GSIS Administration Office for the special reasons such as maternity leave, military leave, etc.

o International Students taking a leave of absence must leave Korea within 15 days of the date in which their leave of absence is officially approved by the Administration Office. Therefore, you need to prepare your own visa if you keep staying in Korea. When you would like to return to KU GSIS, you should notify the GSIS Administration Office by email and request a new Certificate of Admission (COA) in order to apply for new D-2 visa. If you want to know more information on your visa issue, please check HiKorea website or contact the Immigration Contact Center by calling (+ 82) 1345.






