# Leave of/Return from Absence 휴·복학

\* After completing your first semester, it is possible to register online on the Portal (KUPID).

## Leave of Absence

- O KUPID  $\rightarrow$  Registration/Graduation  $\rightarrow$  [University Registration] Application for Leave of Absence/Return
- o Students can take off maximum of 2 consecutive semesters at a time and the total numbers cannot exceed 3 semesters.
- o The period of 'Leave of Absence' is included in the term of years for thesis submission.
- o Contact the GSIS Administration Team for the special reasons such as maternity leave, military leave, etc.

o International Students taking a leave of absence must leave Korea within 15 days of the date in which their leave of absence is officially approved by the Administration Office. Therefore, you need to prepare your own visa if you keep staying in Korea. When you would like to return to KU GSIS, you should notify the GSIS Administration Office by email and request a new Certificate of Admission (COA) in order to apply for new D-2 visa. If you want to know more information on your visa issue, please check <u>Hi Korea website</u> or contact the Immigration Contact Center by calling (+ 82) **1345**.

#### **Scholarships**

GSIS students may pursue scholarships and funds provided under the auspices of the central and local governments as well as the private sector. GSIS also extends partial financial support to students in selective cases to meet costs of extramural intensive academic training and internship programs. In GSIS, many international students will be awarded scholarships (50 to 100 percent of tuition fee) based on their academic performance. In addition, the school also offers a special international scholarship sponsored by other institutions such as POSCO, one of the world's leading steel companies. ### Tuition Payment in 4 Installments

o MUST apply and pay the tuition at a designated time period.

o Students with scholarship amount less than 25% of tuition fee can only apply for this.

### Tuition Reduction for Extra Semesters

o Eligible Applicants: 5th (or later) semester who register for 3 credits or less

### Tuition Payment for Completed Research Semesters

o Eligible Applicants: students who complete the coursework and left with a thesis submission



In order to request for thesis evaluation,

students MUST pass or be exempted from the Qualification Exam: General Exam.

Students who want to be exempted from the General Exam should

1) meet all following requirements and then 2) meet exemption conditions.

#### 1) Requirements for the General Exam

- ① Must be completed in your 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester or later within 6 years of admission.
- O At least 33 credits completed by the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester.
- ③ Accumulative average GPA of 3.0 or higher
- ④ Completed all CORE Courses.
- \* If you do not meet any of requirements above, you are not eligible for the General Exam and Thesis Submission until you meet all the requirements above.
- \* You can take the General Exam from the 4<sup>th</sup> Semester within 6 years from enrollment.

#### 2) Exemption Conditions for the General Exam




## Master's Degree Korean Studies Major Non-Thesis Track Example


