


그렉시트 논의도 그리스에 상처만 안겨

여·야·정 협치로 산적한 과제 풀어야

지난 5년 간 유럽 정치와 경제는 수많은 도전을 겪어 왔다. 아직 불씨가 남은 유로존 재정 위기, '아람의 봄'에 따른 난민의 대거 유입, 이런 혼란을 틀타 세력을 확장한 극우세력의 발호 등의 문제를 슬기롭게 해결하는 게 지난 60여 년 동안 유럽이 이룬 지역통합의 성과를 장기적으로 유지하는 데 중요한 정책과제가 돼 왔다. 그런데 이런 과제를 둘러싸고 최근 유럽에서 나타난 포퓰리즘의 기세가 심상찮아, 유럽의 미래를 위협하고 있다.

❖ Dual Masters Program between Graduate School of International Studies at Korea University and School of Finance and Management at SOAS, University of London

- ◆ Applicable students: KU GSIS students in 1st or 2nd semester
- ◆ September starts - 1 year at KU, 1 year at SOAS, final 6 months at KU
 - (It is possible to get both degrees at least in total 2.5 years.)
 - ※ Tuition should be paid for both Korea University and SOAS(30% discounted)
while you are staying at SOAS.
 - ※ Financial Support: roundtrip airfare, partial support for living expenses

◆ Application Period at KU :

- **April 11th (Mon.) ~ April 21th (Fri.) by 14:00 (Documents by April 28th)**

◆ Interview : Late April (schedule will be sent by email)

◆ Required Documents at KU

- 1) CV(curriculum vitae)
- 2) Application Form(including Statement of Purpose: MS Word 2~3 pages)
- 3) Valid Language Test Score Certificate(Original)
 - - TOEFL iBT 100 (23 in writing and 21 in other subjects)
 - - IELTS Academic 6.5 (6.5 in writing and 6.0 in other subjects)
- 4) KU GSIS Official Transcript(Original)
 - (For freshman, submit the original transcript of undergraduate school)
- ※ After selection at KU, you will be nominated to SOAS.

- 1. Please request consultation to administration office and complete the graduation assessment of KU GSIS first.
- - **Graduation Assessment**: Checking of the remaining courses to fulfill the graduation requirements in time
- - According to the result, please take as many courses as you can at SOAS in advance, considering for credit transfers.
- (ex. Courses conducted in English O, Language courses X)
- 2. Please apply for the **Thesis/Non-thesis Track Application Form in the beginning of 3rd semester at KU GSIS.**
- - This is to declare your Track(Thesis/Non-thesis), Major, and Thesis (Academic) Advisor.

1. If you choose the **thesis track** and plan to graduate in time,

- - Please keep contacting your thesis advisor
 - regarding selecting your thesis topic and plan of research proposal.
 - - Please don't forget to apply for research proposal,
 - and present your research proposal **in your 3rd semester at KU GSIS**.
 - - The method of the proposal can be decided with your thesis advisor.

- 2. Please submit the finalized list of course names and syllabi
 - right after each of the course registration so that we can pre-assess the possibility of credit transfers.

- Most credits earned at SOAS will be transferred, unless you get any 'F' letter grade or have any unexpected situation.

- 1. You have to come back to KU GSIS and complete the remaining required courses in your last semester at KU GSIS.
- - If it is your 5th semester(extra semester) when you come back and only 3 credits or less are left for course completion (considering the credit transfers), you will only pay 50% of tuition fee during the final tuition payment period.
- 2. As soon as you get the official transcript from SOAS,
 - - please submit **Credit Transfer Application Form**,
 - **Official Transcript**, and **Syllabi** of classes you registered.
